### **55 count per kilo and under: 8 cents per pound**

- Based on the following conditions:

1. Minimum 40% usable females
2. Minimum 10% feed content

## **Crab - May 8, 2009**

The Standing Fish Price-Setting Panel, which has the jurisdiction to set fish prices in the province when the Union and the processors are unable to reach agreement, has rejected a request by the Association of Seafood Producers to further reduce crab prices.

The initial price set by the Panel at the end of March was \$1.55 for a Canada/U.S. exchange rate below 83 cents, and \$1.50 for an exchange rate above 83 cents, based on a two-week average.

In a decision dated Monday, May 4, 2009, the Panel reduced these prices by 15 cents a pound to \$1.40 and \$1.35. **The current minimum price is \$1.40 for premium crab (carapace size 4 inches and over).**

ASP immediately went back to the Panel demanding a further price reduction to \$1.12 a pound and the reinstatement of the so-called "price-to-market formula" which adjusted the raw material price every two weeks.

**The Panel turned down this request, and made it clear the Panel is not prepared to reinstate the price to market formula unilaterally.**

The current price of \$1.40 for premium crab remains in effect until May 16<sup>th</sup>. The price for each two week period after that date will be either \$1.40 or \$1.35, depending on the exchange rate in each two week period.

In each case, the price of standard crab (less than 4 inches) is 30 cents less than for premium crab. The usual 20% tolerance is in effect – in other words, the first 20% of standard crab in each shipment is paid at the same price as premium crab.

## **Lump Roe - 2009**

The parties agree that this schedule and the Master Collective Agreement dated May 4, 2006 together constitute a Collective Agreement between the parties for lumproe for the purposes of the Fishing Industry Collective Bargaining Act.

1. At market prices up to \$900 Cdn CIF Europe, fish harvesters will be paid \$1.50 per pound for lumproe.
2. If the market price as outlined in paragraph 3 below exceeds \$900 per barrel, prices to fish harvesters will be increased retroactively based on sales and shipments up to November 30, 2009. Retroactive payments will be due and payable no later than December 10, 2009.

The raw material price will be increased at a rate of \$.01/lb for each \$4 per barrel market price increment in excess of \$900 per barrel. (For example, at \$1,000 per barrel the raw material price would be \$1.75 per pound).

3. Confirmation of average market prices received will be based on sales reports up to and including November 30, 2009 showing volumes and weighted average prices received per barrel

(Cdn\$ CIF Europe) from Ocean Choice International (OCI), Beothic Fish Processors and Iceswater Fisheries. Verification through independent audit or prices received is at the discretion and cost of FFAW.

4. There will be no deductions from these prices for ice and/or water.
5. The parties agree to a three-week lump season in each area. The parties agree to variable seasons by area, provided that no individual licence holder can fish in more than one three-week season. A committee of the FFAW, ASP and Iceswater will be established to monitor landings during the first two weeks with a view to increasing/shortening the season should there be a perceived shortfall/oversupply.
6. Temperatures must be controlled by icing and landed roe must be free of foreign material and excess water.
